

Cycle Speedway report for the NW AGM.

The three North West cycle speedway clubs have all enjoyed a successful season, with a busy calendar of racing.

The midweek Manchester League series has concluded. Stockport won the Division 1 (seniors) team title for the tenth successive year, with Astley & Tyldesley taking the Division 2 (juniors) team title for the fifth successive season.

The three North West clubs are dominating the North & Scotland regional league, contested by nine clubs. Astley & Tyldesley have already clinched the Division 1 title, to retain the championship. Three clubs are currently joint top of the Division 2 table - Astley & Tyldesley, Fife and Sheffield.

The outcome of that league is likely to go to the last match of the season. Astley & Tyldesley have won Division 3 for the sixth successive year, having won all their matches ridden to date. Stockport won the Junior Cup Final at Hull in June.

The three clubs are providing the majority of riders and officials for the North & Scotland team in the Battle of Britain series.

After four of the six rounds, the North & Scotland team are second out of four teams overall, third in the Senior and joint top in the Junior competitions.

The North & East ladies' team have won the Women's League, again represented by riders from the North West.

Astley & Tyldesley successfully hosted Round 2 of the North West Youth League series in July, with 35 riders competing.

Astley & Tyldesley staged the under 16 Girls, Women's and Veterans British Club Championships in June. The club are hosting the u-12 and u-14 Boys and Girls British Individual Championships on Saturday 25th August. Bury are staging the o-40, o-50 and o-60 Veterans British Individual Championships the following day.
